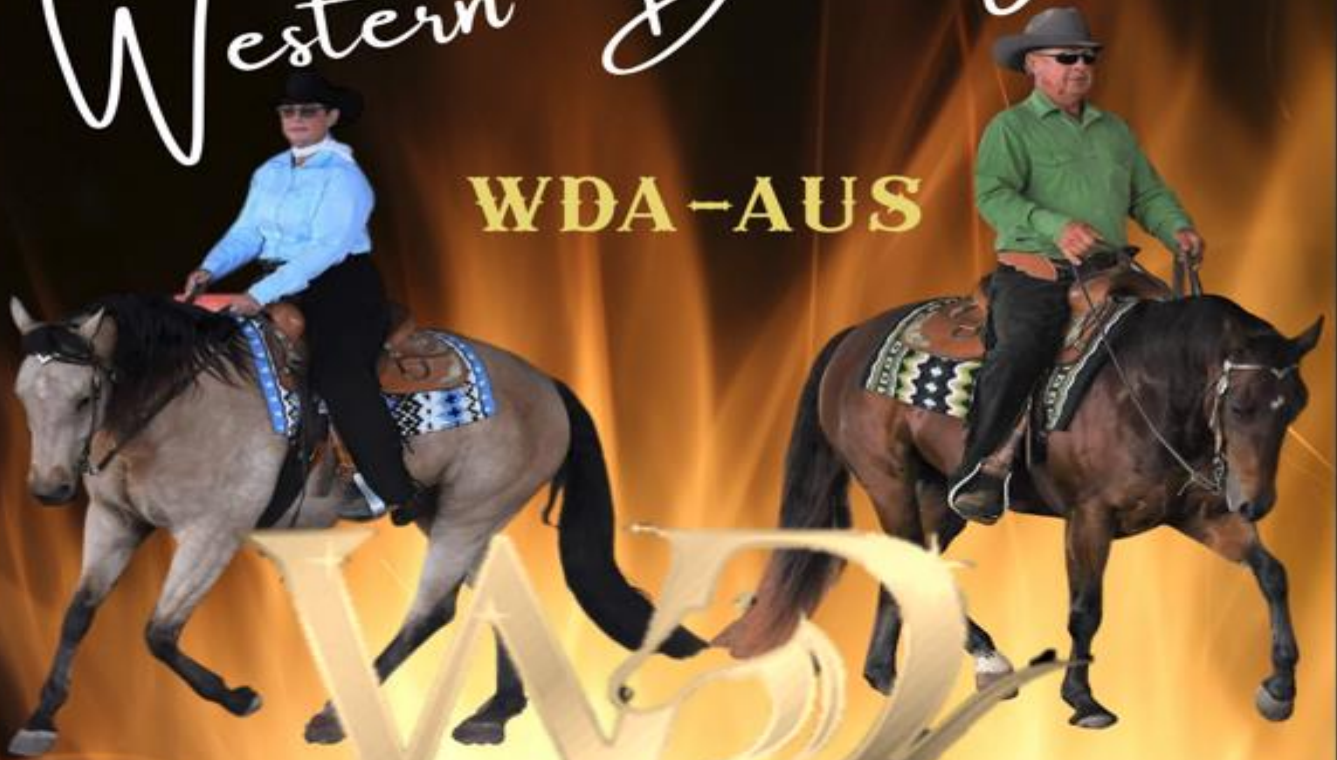

## **Prizes:**

The Highest Aggregate percentage in each Level of Classes will receive a Championship Buckle. These classes will be Introductory, Basic, Level One, Level Two, Level Three & Youth. Other highest aggregate percentages to Fifth place in each Level will receive Prizes as listed in the printed Show Program.

Sashes to Fifth place for each class and Youth competitors within each class.

Highest Aggregate percentage of the Show is open to all Sanctioned levels, across three tests of any level. (Same horse and rider combination).

Youth riders are automatically eligible for placings in each class entered and also separately with other Youth competitors in that class.

Youth Champion is the Horse/Rider combination with the highest average % from 3 sanctioned tests from any level.

Points will accrue from the results of the Sanctioned classes and will go towards the 2022 WDA–AUS National Hi Point Awards and the relevant State EOY High Point Awards.

**Breed Awards will be open to all AQHA, ASHS & AAA registered horses. Must be owned by Financial members of the relevant Breed Society and Membership & Registration numbers will need to be provided when nominating for the show.**

**Paid pre-works will be available from 12.00pm on Thursday 5/5/2022.**

- Pre-works 5 minutes \$10 ea
- Pre-works 10 minutes \$20 ea – Only a maximum total 10 minutes allowed per horse: e.g. 2 x 5 minutes or 1 x 10 minutes.

## **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL SHOW**

- This event will be conducted under Western Dressage Association of Australia Inc (WDA-AUS) rules and regulations.
- Official photographic and video footage will be taken during the event. Participants by entering are giving permission to WDA-AUS to use any and all footage for educational and promotional purposes.
- Non-Sanctioned & Sanctioned classes – Riders must be current Life, Senior or Youth Members of Western Dressage Association of Australia Inc.
- All horses must be WDA-AUS registered with a competition licence; the only exception is the Non-Sanctioned Introductory Level.
- Maximum of 4 tests per horse per day and 2 consecutive levels per horse allowed e.g. Basic/Level 1.
- Horses may be ridden by more than 1 rider. Riders may ride more than 1 horse. Callers are permitted.
- The arena will be available for open pen practice riding up until 30 minutes prior to start time each day, subject to arena maintenance requirements.
- The arena will also be available for open pen practice on Thursday morning from 6.00am up to 11.00am, subject to arena maintenance requirements.
- QSEC Horse Health Declaration must be completed and handed in on your arrival.
- QSEC is a Glass free zone.
- Dogs are not permitted in the Main Arena precinct (except for accredited assistance dogs). Dogs at the stables and camp grounds must be on a lead no longer than 1 metre long and under effective control at all times.

- The Main Arena precinct is liquor licensed and no alcohol can be brought onsite.
- Stable and campgrounds entry is via Gate 14, Old Gympie Road, Caboolture.
- Program is subject to change at the committee's discretion.
- All attempts will be made to ensure the Draws allow riders to compete in both arenas to avoid clashes.
- Presentations – All competitors/handlers to be dressed in appropriate Western attire including Western hat during presentations and to be astride in the line-up.
- All competitors will be expected to return to line up for presentation of all their classes. Presentations will be set out in the printed program. In the Final Championship presentation on Sunday afternoon, only the Top Five competitors will be required for presentation with their horses in the arena. The Show Secretary will provide notification to riders prior to this presentation.
