




Western Dressage Association Victoria

Rider Profile

Q1. Rider Age, Location, Club membership?

I am 40 years old, live in Gidgegannup, WA and am a member of WDAWA (I am also currently the WDAWA President and a WDA-AUS Committee member)

Q2. Horse's Name: EEC Its All Good (Dodger)

Krystelle Park Mercury Rising (Hondy)

A. Horse's Age & Breed: Dodger is a 7yr old 15h brown bay QH gelding

Hondy is a 21yr old 16.2h chestnut Anglo Arabian gelding

B. Horse's Background: I bought Dodger as a green broke 5.5yr old 18 months ago. He had done in-hand classes at western shows prior to me purchasing him, he is a sweet and easy going horse. His main quirk is that he absolutely loves to eat oranges and will do almost anything for one and licks and slurps as he eats it.

I bought Hondy as a 5 month old weaner and he is now retired. He was my introduction to Western Dressage, we both fell in love with it as it suited him to a T and he excelled until a paddock injury forced his retirement

Q3. How long have you been competing in Western Dressage events? I have been competing in Western Dressage events since 2018, I made the switch from English Dressage with Hondy and never looked back.

Q4. What level do you compete in at Western Dressage events?I currently compete with Dodger in Introductory and Basic Level and previously competed on Hondy in Level One and Level Two.

Q5. Have you competed in other horse events previously?I have previously competed in English Dressage, Show Horse and Breed Shows (Western and Arabian)

Q6. What are some of your major horse-related achievements (WD or other disciplines)

I have won many champion, supreme, state champion and high point awards over the years in various disciplines. However, I would consider my major horse-related achievements to be training my Anglo Arabian up to Elementary/Level 2 dressage and him being solid and dependable enough to lend to young children to compete or take to PC.

Q7. Where do you go to show in Western Dressage events?

I compete at the WDAWA western dressage events which are mostly held at Foxwood Farm in Perth, WA.

Q8. What do you like best about Western Dressage?

I fell in love with Western Dressage when I discovered how encouraging it is, how the harmony and partnership between horse and rider is rewarded and that there is no bias toward the breed or type of horse being ridden. I love how you are allowed to pat/touch and talk quietly to your horse. I am lucky to be a part of WDAWA, they are a great group of riders who make our events enjoyable for everyone.

Q9. Who has helped you the most in your Western Dressage journey?

Vanessa Hancox introduced me to the discipline, she has been a wealth of knowledge, support and encouragement over the years and western dressage wouldn't be what it is in WA without her.

My long time dressage coach, Chantelle Currey, was my coach for several years riding English dressage until one day I told her I was switching to western dressage. She helped me research the differences and has helped me train my horse softly, lightly and correctly and we wouldn't have had the success we have had without her in our corner.

Q10. What are your goals with your horse in Western Dressage?

My goals with Dodger are to take him as far up the levels of Western Dressage as I can. He has a great mind and work ethic so I'm excited to see where we can go. I'd like to make the long trip over east for the next Western Dressage National Show with him in 2024.
